Kirby began her 8th grade year at Gower Middle School in Burr Ridge in a classroom filled with special friends. Her teacher, Kitty, and three of the therapists servicing children in the room were already familiar with Kirby, as they all had the opportunity to work with her last year.

Angie, a classroom aide in Kirby's room this year, first met Kirby five years ago as a high school senior who was interested in special education and volunteered her time in Kirby's classroom. She has helped the Wilsons care for Kirby at home ever since, while studying to become a special education teacher.

Sue comments, "The past couple years, Kirby has had to change schools. Brad and I have been concerned about the transition for Kirby with new staff and a different environment. But as luck would have it, last year turned out to be the best year Kirby has had in a long time, and this year is looking just as good. We are

extraordinarily fortunate that Kirby, once again, is surrounded by a group of dedicated and compassionate staff members who are so willing and able to challenge Kirby to be the best she can be and yet accept her limitations with open, caring arms."




